

THE IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON THE LIVING CONDITIONS OF NORTH LONDON'S TURKISH/KURDISH MIGRANT COMMUNITIES

A community-based research project

Day-Mer Turkish and Kurdish Community Centre is working on a community-based research project on the impact of Covid-19 on the living conditions of London's Turkish and Kurdish communities — with a particular focus on the North London area.

The aims of the project are:

- To investigate the impact of the current pandemic and economic crisis on Turkish and Kurdish communities in North London.
- To identify advice and welfare needs and gaps in service provision.
- To inform local policy makers, service providers and the community sector on priorities and development needs.

The project, which will take place between May and June 2021, will include:

- A review and analysis of official statistics other data sources.
- A survey of service users and other members of the Turkish and Kurdish communities, carried out by community researchers.
- Additional in-depth interviews with individuals and key informants.

The final report will be launched in a community event and presented in a number of other settings in order to raise awareness and stimulate a debate amongst the local community, service providers, policy makers, academics and other stakeholders.
